Hands-on Activities

Activity 1: Trail Art: One expression of being witness is to make art for others to experience – as you have seen here in this exhibition! Can you make a little trail art for others to experience? Collect some natural materials and create a design/pattern or little sculpture next to or on the side of a trail. If you are interested in seeing more art made from natural materials, make sure to check out artist Andy Goldsworthy.

Activity 2: As you walk through the Hapgood Wright Town Forest, keep your eye out for a tree that "speaks" to you – you might be drawn to the shape or the bark or the leaves. This tree is your Buddy Tree. What stories might this tree tell? Do you see any animal homes in or under the tree? Are there scars or marks on the trunk? What are the tree's seeds and/or flowers? Think of something you'd like to tell the tree about yourself. Hug the tree. Can you identify the tree? Take a photo or take home a leaf and do some research about this tree. Most importantly, come back and visit – witness the tree's seasonal changes and growth.
