**Day 2** (September 30) Layering and Texture Techniques. Continue Color Mixing.

**Day 3** (October 7) Learn how to see and mix colors: 2D still life.

**Day 4** (October 21) Value in Painting.

Day 5 (October 28) Underpainting Techniques.
