What is the role of a CIT?

CITs are “counselors-in-training”. The purpose of the CIT program is for high school aged young adults ages 14-16 to develop a sense of responsibility through observation, participation, planning and implementation, as well as to assist in the classroom. CIT’s have the opportunity to be a great help to both the teachers and to the children.

The Umbrella’s EXPECTATIONS for CITs

- Above all, *spend time* with the children. The children need to know you are here to help them.
- Be on time and let the Program Coordinator know when you go on break or go home.
- Wear nametags. This helps the kids, the teachers and Umbrella staff.
- Be a positive role model.
- Engage with the children in a fun and positive way.
- Work with the teachers in a helpful, constructive way.
- Do your part in the cleanup process, if everybody helps, it takes less time to accomplish all the tasks.
- Gain an awareness of what is needed at any particular time, TAKE INITIATIVE.
