


Dear Students, WELCOME to my  COLORED PENCIL CLASS!

1). You can certainly use whatever colored pencils you already have. Personally I like PRISMACOLOR.

Some students like DERWENT.

(I think that brand also has some water-soluble colored pencils.)

2). Some watercolors are useful. (For experimental purposes, I like the compact watercolor paint set that comes in a round container & costs only \$4.99.)

3). Another fun combination to use with colored pencils is the Neocolor water soluble crayons. These also come in small sets of either 8 or 15.

4). For paper I like the Arches watercolor blocks. ( Aquarelle Arches Cold Pressed 10" x 14" should be large enough, or even a smaller block.) \* Remember that cold pressed indicates a rougher, textured surface, while hot pressed indicates a smoother surface. It is a totally personal preference. Whatever makes YOU HAPPY!

5). A pad of tracing paper will come in handy.

6). A kneaded eraser & a colored pencil eraser.

7). A colorless blender. ( Like a magic marker, but without any color.)

You may already have a familiar art store, but if not, the one in Concord Center is Albright Art, on 32 Main Street. ( Across the alley from Vanderhoof's Hardware.)
