In 2012, Brian Boruta was named Artistic Director of The Umbrella's performing arts program (est. 2008). Under his leadership The Umbrella has staked its claim as one of the most well-recognized and award-winning theaters in Greater Boston. Brian has brought thought-provoking, engaging, and socially relevant theater to Concord through the production of cutting edge plays and musicals and with fresh presentations and technology for revivals and classics. 




