



2026/27 Artist-in-Residence Call for Applications: Visual Arts

The Umbrella Arts Center, in Concord MA, seeks applicants for its 2026/27 Artist-in-Residence (AiR) Program. Active artists looking to join a vibrant arts community in Greater Boston and further their careers are encouraged to apply. For the 2026/27 season, The Umbrella seeks up to four (4) Visual Arts AiR.

- Residency Dates: September 14, 2026 - August 31, 2027
- Application Deadline: March 29, 2026
- Decision announcement: By May 1, 2026

The Umbrella Arts Center is an active and vibrant interdisciplinary art center with 50+ Studio Artists, an independent ceramics studio and a fully equipped woodshop, robust education programs, multiple galleries with year-round exhibition, and a performance program encompassing an award-winning Stage Company and celebrated Concert Series in the historic center of Concord, MA.

The Umbrella's AiR program brings together a cohort of artists participating in The Umbrella's residency programs in Visual Arts, Education, and Performing Arts. The cohort is encouraged to support each other and their projects throughout the year, and The Umbrella will provide professional development and networking opportunities.

The AiR program is for emerging artists. We define an "emerging artist" as someone who, within approximately the last five years, has either...

- Completed an advanced degree program (such as an MFA).
- Become an early career artist. For example...
 - "I worked as a non-arts or arts-adjacent professional for many years but have now decided to turn my professional focus to my artistic practice."
 - "I am not interested in pursuing an advanced degree, but I am dedicated to building a career as a full-time artist."

If your experience does not fit either of these definitions, but you still define yourself as an emerging artist, please apply and let us know why you identify as such as part of your application.

Applicants may work in any visual medium including painting, sculpture, installation, photography, textiles, digital media, film, mixed media, interdisciplinary, or public art.

The Visual AiR will be an active part of The Umbrella's creative community of more than 50 artists and will have opportunities to collaborate across the organization.

The Umbrella is particularly interested in visual artists who will...

- Use their residency as an opportunity to explore, experiment with, and elevate contemporary art practices and conversations.
- Foster internal and external interdisciplinary collaboration and partnerships.
- Engage our local and broader community with The Umbrella's mission to promote creativity, learning, personal growth, and cultural exchange through accessible arts programming.
- Provide opportunities and points of departure for panel discussions or experiential exchanges with colleagues doing related work.

Residency Requirements: We are looking for artists interested in active engagement with The Umbrella community in Concord and beyond. As part of the residency program, the Artist-in-Residence (AiR) is expected to...

- Make regular, active, and productive use of the studio space (minimum of 20 hours per week) for the length of the residency.
- Present at least one Artist Talk, and any additional public program of any format with the goal of engaging The Umbrella community in your work.
- Participate in The Umbrella's Winter Market (December 4-6, 2026) and Open Studios (May 1-2, 2027).
- Participate in any AiR cohort events and programs.
- Maintain communication with Umbrella staff and participation in program evaluations.

Interest and experience in teaching is a plus.

Residency Award:

- Free access to a studio space shared by all the Visual Arts AiRs. Each AiR will have approximately 160 square feet within the largest studio at The Umbrella with large south facing windows, hardwood floors, tall ceilings, and thermostat-controlled heat and air conditioning.
- Opportunity to be involved in the activities and culture of an interdisciplinary arts center, including access to an independent ceramics studio.
- Opportunity to instruct a full semester of class(es) as well as the potential for additional workshops for qualified candidates. Instructional activities would be compensated at a competitive rate commensurate with a candidate's experience and in line with our other instructors' rates.
- Opportunity to exhibit in The Umbrella's Wedge Gallery, front lawn, and/or alternate site in Concord for site-specific work.
- The Umbrella will support the position through publicity and marketing for the residency as well as any other educational offerings and exhibitions.

- Artist Statement (500 words maximum): Please elaborate on any existing project or a project you'd like to develop during your residency, if applicable.
- Artist resume and/or CV with contact information.
- List of 3 professional references. Please include at least one reference from a member of the faculty of your MFA program, if applicable.
- Artist Image Portfolio. Please include...
 - 10 - 20 high resolution images of work that you have created within the past 2 years.
 - The title, dimensions, medium, and date of all works.

All applications will be evaluated by a jury of The Umbrella's staff and close collaborators based on the body of work submitted, instructional experience, and

enthusiasm for engagement with our community, as well as general experience and quality of resumes.

Select applicants will be invited to a virtual interview.
