The Umbrella Reschedules Season to Ease Cautious Audiences, Artists

Larger Productions Wait Out Worst of Omicron Surge; Black Box Play Moved to Next Season

Concord, MA—The Umbrella Stage Company has completely rearranged the back half of its 2021-2022 season in response to changing public health conditions and concern for its community of artists, audiences, teachers and students. With heightened levels of caution amidst the spike in omicron cases, it has rescheduled its remaining mainstage productions as follows:

April 15 - May 8, 2022 (press showing April 16) - *Head Over Heels*, an exuberant musical comedy from the visionaries behind *Hedwig and the Angry Inch* and *Avenue Q*, fueled by music from the Go-Gos, directed by Brian Boruta.

May 20 - June 6, 2022 (press showing May 21)- *The Colored Museum* – a fresh new presentation of George C. Wolfe's provocative play that redefines our ideas of what it means to be Black in America, directed by Pascale Florestal. Related community engagement events and visual arts exhibitions have also been rescheduled in parallel with the production.

In addition, the world premiere of *Middleton Heights*, a new full-length play commission from playwright Hortense Gerardo will now kick off The Umbrella's next season, September 30 - October 23, 2022, when audiences may feel more comfortable returning to the smaller Black Box theater.

Throughout this season, The Umbrella had eased the concerns of artists and audiences through implementing rigorous Covid safety protocols, exceeding local requirements as it slowly welcomed theatergoers back to its new, state-of-the-art facilities for Audrey Cefaly's romantic comedy, *The Last Wide Open*, the musical epic, *The Old Man and The Old Moon*, and seasonal concert, *Holidays Under The Umbrella*.

The Umbrella joined its peer theaters in implementing heightened cleaning, mask mandates, fully vaccinated workplaces, and required proof of full vaccination or negative Covid test for adult attendees to protect community members. It also kept seating down to roughly half capacity to allow for optimal audience distancing from the cast and each other.
