Pigments:

*The QoR introductory set of 12 will give you a good selection of watercolor pigments to try. If you already have paints or prefer to get larger tubes, use the following list.

QoR, Daniel Smith, M. Graham, Holbien, Utrecht, and Dick Blick are all good brands.

Tube colors, 5 ml:

Cadmium Red, Medium Permanent Rose (Quinacradone Rose)

Ultramarine Blue Pthalo Blue Quinacradone Gold Bismuth Yellow

Burnt Umber (Graham)

Optional but great to have:

Pthalo Green (Winsor Green, Blue Shade) Indigo Blue Permanent Alizarin Crimson Burnt Sienna or Burnt Umber

Cadmium Yellow Light Cadmium Red Light Cobalt Blue Manganese Blue

Transparent Pyrrole Orange Dioxazine Purple

Watercolor Brushes:

Rounds (sablette or nylon) #10, #12 Large round wash brush that comes to a point, ferrule of approximately ½" diameter

½" Flat 1/8" Flat

Painting Surfaces:

At least 5 sheets 22" X 30" or two 10" X 14" or 12" X 16" Blocks. Minimum 140# watercolor paper (1 rough, 1 hot press, 3 cold press or soft press). I like Fabriano Artistico, Lanaquarelle, Saunders, Arches, or Twinrocker.

Other Materials:

Palette- White surface only, minimum 9" X 12" mixing surface

2B pencil

Soft white eraser (Mars Staedler plastic is good)

18" X 24" drawing or painting board

Masking tape

2 water containers

1 squirt bottle

waterproof black drawing ink (India ink).

18" or 24" ruler

Utility knife

Soft paper towels
